	0.0	Start Ride (east from lot)	1.1	START, go east on multi-use trail from parking lot #4	at Smith Middle School, 216 Addison Rd. Glastonbury, CT
	1.1	Right at roadway	0.3	Bell St. Bike path 'T's into Bell Stre	at parking area (under high voltage power lines)
	1.4	Right at 'T'	0.2	Hebron Avenue Bell Street 'T's into Hebron Ave.	at StopSign (busy street, but good shoulder).
	1.6	Left at light	1.0	Wickham Road must get into 'left turn lane'	watch for ridge in new pavement
	2.6	Right at 'T'	1.4	Neipsic Road (Goes under Rte 2)	some narrow shoulder here
	4.0	Straight at lights	1.1	Becomes Hubbard Street as it crosses New London Turnpike	then goes under Rte 17 and along Hubbard green
	5.1	Turn around 180 deg.	1.1	REST STOP at Historical Society of Glastonbury Museum at	Hubbard Green, (will be open for us, and air conditioned).
	6.2	Straight at lights	1.4	Back along Hubbard Street	under Route 17 , then watch for Stop Sign (go straight)
	7.6	Left	1.0	Hubbard Street changes name to Neipsic Road at the light	intersection with New London Turnpike, then under Rte 2.
	8.6	Left	1.0	Wickham Road don't pass	J.B.Williams Park (on left) or start up that steep hill.
	8.6	Right at 'T'	0.2	Hebron Avenue, at Traffic Light (busy street, but good shoulder).	
	8.8	Left	0.3	Bell Street if traffic is heavy, dismount on right shoulder, wait, then	walk the bike across, remount after clearing the intersection.
	9.1	Left	1.1	Bike Path when you are under the 'high voltage' power lines,	and see a 'guard-rail' low bridge over Salmon brook, into park lot.
	10.2	STOP		Smith Middle School	Finish: celebrate, Yeah!

Total Elevation change = 358 ft. (flat)
